
- Representation of approximately 10,000 foundations

- Are funded and managed in a variety of ways, including endowed/non-endowed and operating/grantmaking.








Vision




Total expenditure of public benefit foundations

Number of full time employees in public benefit foundations




Challenges and opportunities





Current challenges in Europe (issue based)

- Impact of crises: war in Ukraine; implications of Covid-19; the effects of climate change
- New type of poverty and increasing inequalities
- Social divisions
- Backsliding in democracy
- Disinformation, uncertain impact of greater use of technology, big data and AI

Context: Rising inequalities & declining public trust


- The new Gilded Age (Callahan, 2017)

- Eurocentrism & disengagement with criticism

How funding practices are evolving


Funding relationships:

- Support experimentation and learning
- Flexible funding
- Core, unrestricted support, OD support
- Listening to grantees and communities, amplifying their voices
- Participatory grantmaking

Internal alignment practices:

- DEI; more open talk about race, gender and power
- Foresights scenario planning
- Interventions more integrated and at scale
- Openness to cross sectoral and sectoral collaborations
- Addressing interconnections among thematic issues
- Social change, systems change
- Flexible work/staff wellbeing, operational agility, climate friendly working style
